Andy Mayhugh presented CUP #119717, Mike McNaul of Pinnacle Properties informed the commission of plans for real estate and housing sales to be located east of Linn Valley Lakes entrance. Ray Miller and County Engineer, Richard Long discussed with the commission the possibility of Franklin County putting in a landfill that could be used on a regional basis. No action taken.

Long reported that three locations the county had approved to bore under black top roads have ran into rock and can't be bored. Long is going to meet with the water districts in the county, and may have to allow them to trench through the blacktop.

Linn County Engineer, Richard Long discussed the county's drug policy. Long wanted to know if any county employee driving a county vehicle and having an accident needs to have a drug and alcohol test. The Board of Linn County Commissioners met for a public hearing to incorporate the City of Linn Valley at the Linn Valley Lakes Clubhouse. Those present were Marty Read, chairman, Harold Mooney, Jr., member; and Donald L. Proffitt, county clerk and William Edwards, county counselor.

At 7:15 p.m., Marty Read, Commission Chairman, called the meeting to order. Introductions of the press and the head table were made, and the order of business for the evening was explained.

Proponents to incorporate the City of Linn Valley were allowed to speak first. First to speak was Duane Gilmore, property owner, who gave his reasons for incorporating, which were limitations of police enforcement and usage of property enforcement. By having local enforcement they would have quicker response time and possibly a faster apprehension time of violators. The second to speak was Bud Kirk. He feels that by not being incorporated they are not receiving the full benefits of the 2.5 million tax dollars they could have levied and compliance of rules and regulations would be enforced.

Opponents to incorporate the City of Linn Valley were allowed to speak next. First to speak was Leon Dennis. He presented a petition to the commission with 112 signatures of people who are against incorporating. Marvin Stone feels that the \$68,000.00 in tax dollars received by the city would not be enough for police enforcement alone. He feels that the problems of Linn Valley Lakes could be solved by improving property values which would draw a better class of people to the area. Gary Holstin, resident, gave the commission a list of reasons not to incorporate and feels it will only raise taxes for the current owners. Lisa Saunders, weekend camper, feels crime will be in the area with or without law enforcement and she felt that it was not fair that non residents were not allowed to vote on this issue. Betty Bullock, property owner outside of the Linn Valley Lakes area, had been informed that she would be annexed into the area and does not want to be part of the city. Mark Tinsley, lot owner, and resident of Paola feels that if residents watch over each other in the neighborhood, they can do a better job than a police force. Also, improving spending habits of the current budget by the Board will alleviate most of the problems at Linn Valley Lakes better than incorporating into a city. Bob Bailey, resident, and member of the Board of Directors, would like to see the county sheriff patrol the area on weekends, by doing this it would take care of most of their crime problems. Richard Goucher, lot owner, feels the sheriff needs to have more money in his budget so that he could patrol the area. Mark White, resident, thinks that code enforcement cannot happen on \$68,000.00 and that it is not cost effective for Linn Valley Lakes to become a city. Tim Tucker, resident, believes that incorporating Linn Valley in the future would be a better idea and that they would benefit from the area by staying the same. He feels that the current Board does not listen to the residents and the majority of people are not being represented. Paul Cooper, was the last to speak. He believes it will cost at least double the amount that would be brought in by incorporating, for law enforcement of Linn Valley Lakes. He thinks that they are moving to fast toward incorporating and needs the board to review their current spending habits. He feels crime is going to be in the area, just as it was in Jonesboro Arkansas.

A rebuttal period for proponents to incorporate was next. No one came forward for a rebuttal from any of the proponents, so there was no rebuttal necessary for opponents.

A questions and answer period was held. The following questions were asked: Will the commission make the decision on whether Linn Valley will incorporate or will Linn Valley Lakes residents be allowed to vote on the issue? It was answered that the decision would be made by the commission. Larry Tinsley, lot owner, asked if the covenants of the Association were presented and if the petition that was presented was legal? William Edwards explained how the petition was presented to the commission and explained how the statutes read, and also explained that they could request incorporating if there are 300 or more residents or 300 or more plated lots, so the petition was legal. Father Pool came up to the front and mentioned that he felt a referendum for recall on petitions might be possible. Larry Tinsley asked what the time frame would be for the commission to make a decision on this issue, and what the decision would be based on? Also, he asked what kind of a city would they be? He was informed that the commission would take what ever time was necessary to hear all sides and would make a decision only when they felt they had all information available. A audience member asked as to what kind of election would be held, and what would they vote on? They were told by Don Proffitt that they would vote on a mayor and 5 council members. Another audience member asked if there would be a bond for city officials and who would pay the cost of a bond? William Edwards informed them that he did not have a answer at this time and would have to look at all the statutes to answer that question.

The President of the Linn Valley Lakes Board came up and clarified the difference between the city official's job and the Board of Directors job. And how each would run as individual entities. This was the cheapest alternative. There will need to be some engineer studies done before this project is started.

Reassigning the Solid Waste Contract with USA was discussed with no action taken.
