## January 4, 1999

The Board of Linn County Commissioners met in a regular session. Those present were Marty Read, chairman; Charles Trask, vice chairman; Harold Mooney Jr., member; Donald L. Proffitt, county clerk; Gary Thompson, county counselor and commissioner elect, Herbert Pemberton.

Charles Trask motioned to approve the minutes of the last regular meeting as printed. Harold Mooney Jr. seconded the motion. The motion passed 3-0.

The commission chairman signed the following add/abate/refund order numbers: personal property #1792-1797.

The commission chairman signed the Acknowledgment of Notice of Mercantile Bank purchasing the contract on the Toshiba 4560 copier S/N XG814729 that the county leased from Mid-Continent Leasing.

The commission gave approval for Darrell Lane to purchase a computer and phone line for the Transfer Station to be put on the Internet. A computer for the transfer station will be added to the p.c.'s the county will order this month.

Lane and the commission discussed hiring a part-time person at the transfer station. After discussion the commission asked Lane to come back in and talk to them in the spring.

The commission agreed that if any employee 65 or older is willing to get on medicare and to be taken off the county insurance, the county will pay for medicare, supplement and pre-existing premiums. Employee Alva Poole had inquired as to the county policy.

Tuesdee Stark presented the county with a letter from K.D.O.T. regarding change order #8 for Boicourt Bridge project #54C2054-01. The commission asked the county counselor to read the report and get back to them with recommendations.

Larry Robinson, Sign Department and the commission discussed the E-911 project. Robinson stated he is approximately 75% complete with addressing. The commission reported they would like to get the project completed as soon as possible.

At the request of Dennis Arnold, Economic Development Director, Marty Read motioned to recess from the Board of Commission meeting into executive session for fifteen minutes to discuss a legal issue, (contract negotiations with Tower Metal Company). Charles Trask seconded the motion. The motion passed 3-0. The commission, clerk, county counselor, Pemberton and Arnold from Linn County and Janet Easley and David Compton with Tower Metal attended the executive session.

Charles Trask motioned to adjourn the executive session and reconvene the Board of Commission meeting. Marty Read seconded the motion. The motion passed 3-0.

As a result of the executive session, Marty Read motioned to sign a contract with Tower Metals for sale of real estate and site preparation costs on the property located west across from the Transfer Station. Harold Mooney Jr. seconded the motion. The motion passed 3-0.

Arnold discussed the bids opened last week. Arnold stated that Brake Excavating withdrew their bid which had been the low bid. Arnold recommended Halls Backhoe, the next low bid of \$49,976.00. Marty Read motioned to accept the bid from Halls Backhoe Service, Osawatomie of \$49,976.00 to extend the utilities to the east LaCygne Industrial Park. Charles Trask seconded the motion. The motion passed 3-0.

Sheriff Marvin Stites presented the commission with an agreement for S.E.K. Correctional Facility to board prisoners for Linn County. Charles Trask motioned to sign the agreement that requires a \$40.00 per day cost to Linn County. Marty Read seconded the motion. The motion passed 3-0.

Jim Schmitz, Schmitz Surveying reported that he would be willing to do contract work for Linn County pertaining to surveyor duties for drafting he would like \$30.00 per hour and for survey work he would like \$40.00 per hour. The commission reported they are interested in contracting with Schmitz and would also like to talk to Springer Surveying.

Charles Trask motioned to recess from the Board of Commission meeting for fifteen minutes to discuss a personnel matter related to a non elected employee. Marty Read seconded the motion. The motion passed 3-0. The commission, clerk, county counselor, and Pemberton attended the executive session.

Charles Trask motioned to adjourn the executive session and reconvene the Board of Commission meeting. Marty Read seconded the motion. The motion passed 3-0.

As a result of the executive session, Charles Trask motioned to put Kermit Chase under the direct supervision of District #3 Road Supervisor, Harry Wisdom. Marty Read seconded the motion. The motion passed 3-0.

Marty Read motioned to approve an emergency vehicle permit for John Waldmer, Mound City . Charles Trask seconded the motion. The motion passed 3-0.

Charles Trask motioned to pass Resolution 99-01 schedule of pay dates and 99-02 schedule of wages. Marty Read seconded the motion. The motion passed 3-0. Following is a copy of Resolution 99-01 and 99-02:

Larry Robinson, Sign Department turned in his monthly report.

The commission heard a complaint from District 3 Road Foreman, Harry Wisdom, because they don't get paid time and one half for weekend work when unless they have worked 40 hours. They felt they should get overtime for Saturday or Sunday work whether they had worked 40 hours or not. The commission advised him they will consider the request.

Harold Mooney Jr. motioned to sign the front page of the Mid Continent Bridge design project #54C-3452-01. Charles Trask seconded the motion. The motion passed 3-0.

Marty Read motioned to recess from the Board of Commission meeting into executive session for 15 minutes to discuss a legal matter related to a minimum maintenance road and for a personnel issue to discuss a personnel matter related to a non elected employee. Harold Mooney Jr. seconded the motion. The motion passed 3-0. John Black and Larry Robinson attended the legal session but left at the beginning of the personnel session. The commission, clerk, county counselor and Pemberton were there for both the legal and personnel matter.

Marty Read motion to adjourn the executive session and reconvene the Board of Commission meeting. Charles Trask seconded the motion. The motion passed 3-0. No action taken as a result of the personnel executive session.

As a result of the legal executive session, the commission instructed Robinson and Black that all minimum maintenance roads in the county be posted to that effect.

The commission signed a contract with Tower Metals that has been corrected to show Tower Metals to be a limited Partnership instead of a Limited Liability Company. The contract had been originally signed at last weeks meeting.

Steve Springer, Springer Surveying met with the commission to discuss the possibility of Springer doing survey work for the company. After discussion Charles Trask motioned to accept the proposal of Springer to do survey work with his crew at \$65.00 per hour with county personnel at \$30.00 and office work at \$18.00 per hour. Harold Mooney Jr. seconded the motion. The motion passed 3-0.

Marilyn Augur, Nutrition Director met with the commission to discuss Mound City Senior Center Building Board members. After discussion, Marty Read motioned to appoint Joe Wurtz and Patty West to the Mound City Senior Center Building Board. Charles Trask seconded the motion. The motion passed 3-0.

Also Augur discussed the way Building Boards handle renting and repair of buildings and asked if the commission would like to process changed. The commission asked Augur to contact the Building Boards members and get there ideas.

The commission reviewed the 1998 Linn County Park receipts and expenditures. No action taken.

Andy Mayhugh, Zoning Administrator presented a grant of road easements with a boundary change. Marty Read motioned to accept the grant of road easement from Maurice and Francis L. Cox. Harold Mooney Jr. seconded the motion. The motion passed 3-0.

Jamie Basore, Pleasanton reported he had driven into a large hole on a minimum maintenance road that didn't have any signs and damaged his vehicle beyond what the insurance company would pay him and he asked that the county make up the \$1700.00 difference. The commission reported they will study the issue and get back to him.

A certified person would be one who has attended the states bridge inspection course. The commission asked the clerk to contact Schwab Eaton Engineering Co. and see if they would be interested in contract consulting to the county.

At 11:00 a.m. the commission recessed for a retirement party for outgoing 1st District Commissioner Harold Mooney Jr. . Commission Chairman Read presented Commission Mooney with a plaque from the county.
